



What is a Critical Incident?

A Critical Incident can include, *but is not limited to:*

- Natural Disaster
- Drug and Alcohol abuse
- Domestic/ Racially-motivated violence/abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Missing Students
- Student suicide attempt
- Student robbery/physical assault or other personal attack
- Acute illness (physical or mental)
- Student death
- Student in legal difficulties
- Chemical, radiation or bio-hazard spillage
- Fire, explosion, bomb threat
- A situation that may disrupt the welfare arrangements for a student under the age of 18
