Sobering Up Centres

These centres provide a safe environment in which people, who are found intoxicated in public, may sober up. A person being cared for in a Sobering Up Centre can expect:

- Access to bathroom facilities, a shower, bed, clean clothes, and a simple nutritious meal;
- Non-discriminatory and non-judgemental care;
- Referral to other agencies and services if required.

People may refer themselves to a centre or be brought in by the police, a local patrol, health/welfare agencies, or by other means. Attendance at a centre is voluntary. Please see below for a list of Sobering Up Centres:
